Executive Director Summary: April 2021

Message From Executive Director

We've been preparing and discussing for months the day will come when activity picks up both on the street and in the DCA office. April 2021 was the month downtown saw a rejuvenation of visitors and activity throughout the district. The month started off with an influx of visitors who chose to enjoy their Spring Break in Chattanooga. Spring Break was followed by graduation celebrations and high school prom. Also during the month of April, activities were taking place throughout the city which brought participants and their families downtown to our hotels, attractions, and businesses. As you read through the report, the statistic show that the Ambassador team was ready and stepped up to the challenge to keep the district clean, safe, and friendly.

April also allowed us to continue the "Cash for Trash" pilot program and as the days went by, we had more people show up and participate. One of the program goals was to connect with individuals who may be resistant to services. In late April, a person who had participated daily in the "Cash for Trash" program and been resistant to services pulled an Ambassador aside and asked if we could help him obtain his State I.D. and documents. We convened a meeting with an Outreach Specialist and that lead to the program participant obtaining a Case Manager.

As we move into May, we look forward to activation and events returning downtown. It will be a great opportunity to show the value of the DCA and work with our partners to make sure the visitor experience is above and beyond expectations.

The DCA will also work on some landscape projects in May and into June. We hope these additions will add to the beautification of downtown and lead to more projects in the future.

Executive Summary: Clean Team Highlights, April 2021

Accomplishments

During the month of April, Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Ambassadors achieved the following special projects and cleaning accomplishments:

1. Power wash stains, smells, and deep cleaned sidewalks for 82 hours, a decrease of 21.9% from March 2021;

2. Removed 47 graffiti tags and stickers observed around the district, a decrease of 52.5% from March 2021;

3. Cleaned 49 incidents of biohazards and disinfected the immediate surrounding area, an increase of 172.2% from March 2021;

4. Performed 198 hours of special projects which mainly involved painting, running the ATLV (All Terrain Litter-Vac); and backpack blowing, an increase of 17% from March 2021;

5. Collected 300 bags of trash, a decrease of 21.6% from March 2021;

6. Performed weed abatement on 58 block faces, an increase of 123% from March 2021;

7. And cleaned and sanitized *** trash cans throughout the district an increase of *** from March 2021.

Executive Summary: Hospitality Team Highlights, April 2021

Accomplishments

During the month of April, Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Ambassadors achieved the following hospitality accomplishments:

1. Provided 3,468 directions and recommendations, an increase of 62.5% when compared to the month of March;

2. Conducted 120 business checks, an increase of 81.8% when compared to the month of March;

3. And passed out 15 rain ponchos to visitors who got caught in the rain.

Executive Summary: Outreach Highlights, April 2021


Accomplishments

During the month of April, Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Ambassadors achieved the following Outreach Accomplishments:

1. Conducted 96 individual in-depth engagements (each last 3 minutes or more) with individuals experiencing homelessness in the DCA district;

2. Made 32 referrals for shelter and food;

3. And provided 25 bottles of hand sanitizer, 22 articles of clothing and two pairs of shoes.



Cleaning Highlights

Accomplishments

During the month of April, the Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Clean Team strived to keep downtown the cleanest place in the City. The team even received a comment from a visitor stating, "this is the cleanest city in America, and I've visited a lot of them." Comments like that, keep the Ambassadors motivated to perform their daily tasks as they continue to remove graffiti, pick up trash, sanitize and remove biohazards and perform special projects.

The Special Projects team was productive and busy during the month. The team dedicated 198 hours towards painting trash cans, light and traffic poles, as well as parking meters. Also, we worked along side Public Works, CDOT, and CPD to prepare the district for Mayor Kelly and the City Council's swearing in ceremony at the Tivoli which was followed by a parade to City Hall. The team also spent time deep cleaning around AT&T stadium in advance of the Chattanooga Lookouts home opener.

The Special Projects team focused weekly on weed eating and weed abatement through the DCA district. It's a challenge to keep up with, but the team works hard to remove the weeds and hopefully will catch up as we move through May.

We continue to dedicate many hours pressure washing the sidewalks as this was a priority we heard about from the survey results prior to the DCA being formed. The team completed projects along Power Alley, Chestnut St, and Broad St. We look forward to beginning work on Market St over the next month or so.

Overall, the team continues to provide enhance cleaning on a daily basis. As we move through Spring and into Summer we look forward to making the district shine as we welcome back employees, events and activation.







