Executive Director Report

Message From Executive Director

As the Downtown Chattanooga Alliance (DCA) begins its fourth year, its mission remains unchanged – to enhance the beautification, cleanliness, and safety of Chattanooga's Business Improvement District. As downtown emerged from the pandemic in 2022, events like Riverbend and Little Debbie Ironman returned for the first time since 2019. Businesses such as Walk-ons, Burger Republic, Wooden City, and others chose to invest in downtown by opening new locations. River City Company brought Rock the Riverfront which included "Impulse" to Chattanooga for the first time. This festival was such a success that River City is bringing "Los Trompos" downtown in March/April 2023. Steam Logistics and Noon Development redeveloped the long-vacant John Ross building into its new headquarters.

In December 2022, the DCA held its first in-person annual meeting at Gilman's Event Hall, made possible by Ken and Byron Defoor. More than thirty attendees learned about the DCA's accomplishments and listened to updates to the strategic plan. Guest speakers included Chief Scruggs and Lieutenant Montgomery, Chattanooga Police Department; Emily Mack, President and CEO of River City Company; and Dan Reuter, Director of the Chattanooga-Hamilton County Regional Planning Agency.

The DCA reported the following highlights:

Achievements (August 2021-July 2022)

- · Provided more than 46,000 hospitality assists
- · Removed more than 1,100 biohazards from doorways and sidewalks
- · Removed more than 1,900 graffiti tags and stickers
- · Provided more than 700 business checks

Strategic Plan

- · Created a planning committee comprised of DCA board members Keeli Crewe, Kelly Fitzgerald, Adam Kinsey, and Councilman Darin Ledford.
- · Held meetings that were facilitated by Jim Kennedy
- · Interviewed 15 property owners for the Community Scan Process. Community scans were one-on-one interviews with DCA stakeholders, property owners & business owners, and others.

DCA Strengths

· Turned early detractors into supporters through consistent delivery of high quality services.





- · Provided strong leadership from the DCA Executive Director, Executive Committee, and Board of Directors.
- · Established, directed, and managed the Ambassadors Program.
- · Improved the district's cleanliness and beautification.

Improvement Opportunities

- · Public Safety.
- · Improve communication with stakeholders such as deployment schedules.
- · Be conscious of mission drift.
- · Find the balance between compassion for the homeless and concern for visitors experiencing aggressive panhandling and verbal abuse.
- · Visit BIDs in other cities to study best practices.
- · Embrace seasonality by adjusting services to conform to peak visitor periods.
- · Eliminate sidewalk solicitation through reasonable enforcement.
- · Work with the CPD and mayor's office to increase the bike patrol.

Strategic Initiatives

- · Provide the highest quality visitor experience.
- · Form committees of board members and stakeholders in areas of mutual interests such as beautification and safety.
- · Create DCA sub-committees on safety, marketing, and communication.
- \cdot Hold mayor's office and property owners accountable for the Baseline Service Agreement.
- · Create and implement a Communications Plan.

The DCA thanks those who served on the Strategic Planning Committee and participated in the community scan for their time and commitment. Their discussion and feedback will help the DCA grow and better fulfil its mission.

Although the DCA has many challenges ahead, a quote from Cindy Fain, one of the business owners, helps shine a spotlight on what the DCA has achieved.

Executive Summary: Clean Team Highlights, December 2022

Accomplishments

During the month of December, Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Ambassadors achieved the following special projects and cleaning accomplishments.

- 1. Power washed stains, smells, and deep cleaned sidewalks for 56 hours a decrease of 2% when compared to November 2022.
- 2. Removed 74 graffiti tags and stickers observed around the district an increase of 3% when compared to November 2022.
- 3. Cleaned 40 biohazards and disinfected the immediate surrounding area, a decrease of 43% when compared to November 2022.
- 4. Collected 1,257 bags of trash a decrease of 6% when compared to November 2022.
- 5. Performed weed abatement on 29 blocks a decrease of 9% when compared to November 2022.
- 6. Cleaned 249 trash cans, a decrease of 6% when compared to November 2022.

Accomplishments

During the month of December, Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Ambassador Hospitality Team did the following:

- 1. Provided 1,297 directions and recommendations, a decrease of 17% when compared to November 2022.
- 2. Conducted 123 business checks, an increase of 37% when compared to November 2022.
- 3. Provided 8 motorist assists, an increase of 100% when compared to November 2022.




