#### **Message From Executive Director**

As the Executive Director for the Downtown Chattanooga Alliance (DCA), I have the opportunity to write a monthly message for the property owners, businesses, residents and the community to read. I usually communicate what the DCA has accomplished and the importance the organization provides for the area we service. This month I would like to talk about a conversation I had with a lady who is interested in moving to Tennessee.

During the month of May, I received a call from a past Board Member in one of the large cities I used to work in. He and I keep in contact on a regular basis. I bounce ideas off his head and we discuss the state of downtowns. He's always very positive with the work I do and believes in my professional abilities.

When I saw his number pop up on my phone, I answered and we exchanged pleasantries. He stated the reason he was calling.

"I have a client who wants to move from the Philadelphia area to Tennessee. I told her she wants to live close to a smaller size city with a university, so she can enjoy the events and activities the city and university provides. I mentioned Knoxville and Chattanooga. She did some research and she is really concerned about the public safety aspect of Chattanooga. I told her I know a guy who moved to Chattanooga with his family and absolutely loves it. Would you mind speaking to her?" stated the former board member.

"Of course, send me her number and I will answer her questions." I said.

The next day I spoke with the lady over the phone. She stated her public safety concerns from the research she conducted on the internet. She mentioned that she currently lives in a small town with little crime and place you can leave your front door unlocked. She talked about some other cities and towns in Tennessee she was looking at, but nothing seemed to be the right fit. She was really interested in South East, TN, but again very concerned about the negative media attention shed on our city regarding public safety.

I addressed her concerns about public safety and my experience in Chattanooga versus other large cities I have lived in. We talked about Mayor Kelly's "One Chattanooga" and the recently released Community Violence Reduction plan. We discussed County Mayor Wamp's plan to address the public school system amongst other city and county initiatives. We discussed homelessness and the all the work being done to address the concerns around it.

Her response, "I would have never known this was going on if I didn't talk to you. I'm glad the City of Chattanooga is working on these challenges. It makes me feel better. That information did not pop up on my searches in the internet"





I stated why I love Chattanooga and South East, TN. The free live music from up on the mountains, to down on the river and throughout the city. We talked about the small locally owned businesses, the wonderful restaurants, culture and public art throughout the city. We talked about hiking, fishing, swimming in watering holes, lakes, off roading, tubing and more. Since, I knew she worked from home, I talked about EPB's high-speed internet that is unmatched anywhere else in the United States.

At the end of our conversation she said, "You know, you won't believe this, but I grew up hunting and fishing. I was a country girl, I loved being a country girl and I miss it. You've really sold Tennessee and I'm interested in some of the mountain areas you mentioned just outside of Chattanooga."

Chattanooga is a great city and like every city we have challenges. But unlike other cities, Chattanooga has created and implemented plans to address the challenges. The media and internet have created a public safety shadow on Chattanooga, but to me, that is a perception and not a reality. The narrative is being changed and we need to communicate that so we can continue to grow as one of the best places in the south.

A safe, clean and beautiful downtown is one piece of the puzzle to change the narrative. The DCA will continue to work on those aspects of our mission and we'll continue to be a strong partner throughout the city to help in any way we can.




### Executive Summary: Clean Team Highlights, May 2023

#### **Accomplishments**

During the month of May, Downtown Chattanooga Alliance Ambassadors achieved the following special projects and cleaning accomplishments.

- 1. Power washed stains, smells, and deep cleaned sidewalks for 3 hours a decrease of 78% when compared to April 2023.
- 2. Removed 154 graffiti tags and stickers observed around the district an increase of 83% when compared to April 2023.
- 3. Cleaned 43 biohazards and disinfected the immediate surrounding area a 0% increase/decrease when compared to April 2023.
- 4. Collected 1,569 trash bags, a decrease of 3% when compared to April 2023.
- 5. Performed weed abatement on 88 blocks an increase of 363% when compared to April 2023.
- 6. Cleaned 447 trash cans, an increase of 107% when compared to April 2023.

- 1. Provided 2,732 directions and recommendations an increase of 26% when compared to April 2023.
- 2. Conducted 107 business checks, an increase of 88% when compared to April 2023.
- 3. Provided 5 motorist assists, an increase 66% when compared to April 2023.


